THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI-BOONEVILLE: ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

Application and Admission: Applicants are encouraged to apply for admission online at www.olemiss.edu/booneville. If you need assistance, personnel at the UM-Booneville office can help you. Mississippi residents must pay a non-refundable \$50 application fee. The non-resident application fee is \$75.

Applicants for admission (undergraduate or graduate) are advised to submit the application for admission well in advance of the period in which enrollment is sought. Please mail official transcripts from all prior colleges to the admissions office in Oxford. Applicants applying for the spring can find application deadlines on the academic calendar at www.olemiss.edu/depts/registrar/acal.html. Late application may require the applicant to register after classes begin and pay associated late registration fees. (See academic calendar for details.)

All regional students **MUST** be admitted to The University of Mississippi **before** they will be allowed to register for courses.

Immunization Requirement: All applicants born after January 1, 1957, must submit proof of two immunizations for measles and one for rubella prior to registration. The medical history and certificate of compliance forms are available at the UM-Booneville office and at www.olemiss.edu/booneville.

Registration: Registration is accomplished via **myOleMiss**. Students register for classes and make schedule adjustments using their Web ID. New students may contact the office for instructions and assistance.

Advisors: Advisors from the Oxford campus will be available during Priority Registration. On-going academic counseling is available during office hours at the UM-Booneville **OR** UM-Tupelo office throughout the semester. Please call the UM-Tupelo office at 662-844-5622, **OR** the UM-Booneville at 662-720-7781 for an appointment.

Textbooks: Textbooks may be purchased through our online ordering system. From the UM-Booneville homepage (olemiss.edu/booneville) click on "Current Students" and then "Order Textbooks" (under the Academic Resources listing).

Withdrawal and Refund: Deadline dates for withdrawals are listed in the academic calendar. Refunds are computed based on the time of official notification of withdrawal according to the 2025 catalog. There are no refunds after the 10th class day—**February 3rd**. A full refund will be granted if the class is cancelled by the University.

Vehicle Registration And Parking: Campus police staff are provided by Northeast Mississippi Community College, and all NEMCC traffic and parking rules should be obeyed. **Do not register for them online.**

2025 Spring Academic Calendar

- Oct. 28-Nov. 11** Priority Registration.
- Oct. 28-Nov. 30** Phase 1 Registration period.
- November 8** Application for first-time enrollment should be submitted no later than this date.
- December 1** \$50 registration fee assessed this date. Phase 2 registration.
- January 20** Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday.
- January 20** Last day to officially cancel registration and avoid responsibility for payment of tuition and fees.
- January 21** Classes begin; registration fee (\$100) assessed this date; 100% refund (less 5% of fees or \$100, whichever is less) on withdrawals through February 3. Phase 3 registration.
- January 27** Students may add courses on a space available basis through this date.
- February 3** Last day to register or add courses (between January 28 and February 3 may add only with instructor's approval.) Refund period ends.
- February 4** \$10 fee assessed per drop or add.
- February 10** Mandatory drop date for non-attendance.
- March 7** Deadline for course withdrawals (no refund); refund period ended February 3.
- March 8-16** Spring Break.
- April 18** Good Friday.
- May 2** Classes end.
- May 5-9** Final examinations.
- May 10** Commencement.
