- Examine how memorials, museums, and memorial museums communicate complex narratives, inspire consideration, and influence public memory.

Pre-Requisites

In order to enroll in either course, students must have completed WRIT 102/LIBA 102/HON 102 or an equivalent second-semester, first-year writing course.

Costs

\$1,050 Plus Tuition. The program fee includes shuttle/van transportation to and from destination, local transportation during course, and lodging/accommodation during travel. Not included in program fee is tuition, most meals at travel site, and personal spending money.
